

West Northants set to welcome the Women's Rugby World Cup!

Colour and hope in an uncertain world

Isn't it great after the long dreary days of winter to see the bulbs coming up, bringing with them a bit of colour and hope in our rather uncertain world. At the risk of sounding a bit cheesy, that's what we try and do at the Foodbank.

Angela finds the Foodbank a lifeline for herself and two boisterous children. She has a chance for a cup of tea and an adult conversation whilst her children run around. She leaves with a bag of food, 'without which we wouldn't be able to eat', and a smile on her face.

Before Covid we used to have regular visits from Tenancy Support Officers and members of the Money Advice and Welfare Benefits Teams who would collect a food bag to deliver to a tenant who needed their help and advice. Now the teams have moved out of Towcester and are largely home-based so there are fewer boots on the ground when it comes to seeking help. But the Foodbank is still here on Islington Road, and many people use us as a first point of contact when they are in need. We will have a chat over a hot drink and signpost our guests to the support they need using our contacts in the local community, whether that is Renew Café, help finding a job, or the Council Teams. We are now the triage point for people in need in Towcester.





Signposting to extra support

Sinead said she had to come to the Foodbank because it was so expensive for her son to get to college in Northampton. A friendly volunteer was able to show her how to apply for assistance for transport costs through WNC. She hasn't visited us since.

Our Citizen's Advice worker can help with most things, and if not should be able to signpost you to someone who can. During the last year to October 2024 we were able to help 194 guests improve their financial situation by a total of £244,000, representing a significant gain for the local community – all free of charge.

Edna came in some distress. Her disabled husband had died and without his disability benefit she couldn't afford to carry on. Not only was this elderly lady dealing with the grief of bereavement but also she faced a significant loss in income to which there was no obvious solution. After a cup of tea and support from our friendly volunteers she left with dry eyes and bags of food and supplies.

None of this would be possible without the help, smiles and commitment of our volunteers. Despite all their other commitments, whether it is work, college, care duties for the generation above or below, enjoying their free time, or anything else more attractive than sorting stock in a cold garage, they reliably turn up twice a fortnight to fulfil their session on the rota, or perhaps weekly, collecting donations from around Towcester and delivering them to our warehouse.

Kick Off Summer and support Towcester Town FC's Junior Six-a-Side Spectacle 2025








VE AND VJ DAY FOR TOWCESTER: A RECOLLECTION

85 Years ago, on September 1st, 1939, the Second World War began. With German troops marching into Poland, Britain and France saw no other option but to declare war on Hitler's ever-expanding Reich. Five years later, Berlin was in ruins, and Hitler was dead; it would be another year until Germany's last ally, Japan, surrendered. From the bocage-ridden pastures of France to the humid Burmese Jungles, the war stole lives in the millions. Man, woman, and child, both military and civilian, all suffered through unimaginable pains, trials, and loss. It is this sacrifice that unifies so many countries of this world, and it is for this sacrifice that we commemorate those two vital days that ended the conflict: VE and VJ day.

Northampton and its surroundings were not immune to the drums of war. As early as 9th August 1940, the news reported that Private Arthur Ralph Rickard had gone missing. The mentioned news article stated that Rickard, "should have completed his studies at Culham College, Oxford, before taking up teaching in June this year". Instead he, like so many other young men, boldly enlisted into the British Expeditionary Force, and fought to defend France from invasion.

Towcester had the war brought to its very doorstep. Multiple archival sources confirm that fundraisers were held by figures such as Lord Hesketh to support various wartime causes. One picture even shows an Elephant visiting Towcester's streets to promote Red Cross donations!



The town was also involved militarily. Articles reveal that Towcester's very own racecourse was requisitioned by the military. During this time, the racecourse mainly appears to have stored military ordnance. It even stored the battlemaps for the famous Battle of Arnhem: The operation which the 1977 film "A Bridge Too Far" was based upon.

Calamity was also felt during this time. An American glider, one of many used for the unreliable deployment of troops behind enemy lines, detached from the plane towing it and crashed into farmland near Tiffield. It serves as a sobering reminder that this was not a stagnant war, it was innovative finding new ways to kill, and many men died due to these new, often unreliable, developments.

Multiple locals have all shared their recollections of VE day in Towcester. A great celebration was held at the Market Square, which involved singing, dancing, holding hands, waving flags and more. Each account varies with their own distinct character, at least two both note they were bedridden with illness and consigned to watching the festivities from afar. However, they all made it very clear that the pubs weren't at risk of going out of business that night!

Whilst the war in Europe was over, the battles still waged on far to the East. Campaigns against the Japanese in Burma, now Myanmar, had not stopped. One Towcester soldier, Bill Causebrook, had laboured as a prisoner for over three years under the brutal supervision of the Japanese Army. He was forced to construct the infamous "bridge over the River Kwai", through which he bore the squalor and inhumanity of his captors. He was witness to countless comrades perishing under such conditions and very nearly risked execution, had the bombing of Hiroshima and Nagasaki not forced an end to Japan's war..

Unlike those returning from Europe, those men who endured the campaigns in Asia did not receive a Hero's welcome. They became the "Forgotten Army": men who are so painfully overlooked for their contributions to the war. Mr. Causebrook, however, did find welcome in Towcester as the church bells rang out to celebrate their safe return.

A news article dated August 17th, 1945, confirms that a night of commemoration was indeed held in Towcester. A night of church services were begun by Rev. G Roper. A floodlit town square then saw the whole town come together to sing and dance. Merriment and jubilation were in abundance, which lasted all the way until midnight.

The next day, a fancy dress event, judged by Lord Hesketh among others, paraded from the square to the Sponne playing field. There were three winners: One costume embodying peace, another personifying the victorious British Empire, and the final belonging to a young boy covered in old wartime memorabilia nicknamed, "Goodbye-To-All-This"! Smiles and laughter can be seen all around in the associated picture of the article. It's a fascinating summary of the three things that the town was happy to see prevail with the end of the war. After the fancy dress competition came a gymnastics display from St John's school, followed by a judged baby show which concluded the events over the Grammar School playing field.

That evening, the community concluded events with a torchlight procession through the streets of Towcester from the market square to the recreation ground. There, everybody gathered to celebrate under the glow of a burning bonfire, the flash of fireworks, and the sound of music which they danced to. All of which is proof of one thing: Towcester had not forgotten or overlooked the war in Asia, and were no less overjoyed to see an end to it as to the end in Europe.

As I finish, I am drawn to think of more recent news. Only recently, on March 17th, the world lost Group Captain John Hemingway. With him, Britain has lost its last surviving airman who fought in the Battle of Britain. It is a saddening reminder that the Second World War is fast fading from a lived memory of this world, to a matter consigned to archives and books. I therefore urge every reader to not just remember the end of the war, but also the brave souls, from Towcester and beyond, who made that victory worth cherishing. Have an excellent VE and VJ day.

Charles Rennie Macintosh and the Bassett-Lowke Family

78 Derngate was famously re-modelled by Charles Rennie Mackintosh in 1916 for his client, Northampton model engineer, W.J Bassett-Lowke. Purchased for Bassett-Lowke by his father as a wedding present, the house had originally been constructed 100 years previously. 



A Force For Good In The Community

Marie Weller, a resident of Towcester, was an active participant in the Suffragette movement and is laid to rest in the town's cemetery, alongside her Holloway brooch and a certificate presented to her by Emmeline Pankhurst. The children were highly engaged and eager during Sue's presentation, and parents have expressed heartwarming feedback, appreciating the valuable lessons their children have learned!



A tribute from the WI Gardening Team

Margaret was one of the founding members of our WI Gardening Team which was set up 23 years ago, in 2002.
Community meant a lot to Margaret and having lived all her life in Towcester she took a pride in the town and was determined to improve the environment and make Towcester "a green and pleasant town." And at 91 Margaret was still gardening with us. In fact, she planted up the new planter in Sponne Arcade on a cold winter's day in December.

A week before Margaret died, she ordered snowdrops for the WI to plant in the town. These have now been planted under a tree on Sawpits Green and amongst the daffodils in the flower bed at Sawpits Centre car park.

We couldn't stand still on Margaret's watch – her favourite trick was to point her walking stick to where a weed needed pulling out and occasionally we found the stick prodding us! But Margaret's knowledge and skill was invaluable to our team and she was behind every project we undertook.

After the WI Gardening Team revamped the Garden of Remembrance in 2018 to commemorate the end of WW1, it was Margaret's inspiration that we should approach the local schools to see if they could create some art work to be placed alongside the poppy cascade and what a triumph that turned out to be!

Margaret was awarded a Citizen of the Year award by the Town Mayor in 2022 for her work with our Gardening Team and she accepted the award for Volunteer Team of the Year from SNVB on our behalf in 2023.

Age never deterred Margaret in taking an active part in all the aspects of the WI organisation – she was with us at our "flash mob" singing of Jerusalem at the Farmer's Market in February.

Margaret has left a great legacy to the town - each year we will see her flowers blooming around the town and we will be able to bear witness to her inspirational art boards at the Garden of Remembrance.

We will always remember Margaret with deep affection - she was, indeed, a truly inspiring woman. We shall miss her dearly.





Tove Benefice Team Delivers Sixth Vital Ambulance and Medical Supplies to Ukraine





On 25th March, the St Lawrence Church (Tove Benefice) team arrived in Ukraine with the 6th local ambulance donation, which was packed full of donated hospital and emergency equipment, including amongst other items donated by Oxford NHS Foundation Trust, 15 Portable Children's Ventilator systems. In addition, life saving bleed control packs were purchased using funds raised. Fundraising for this trip started just over a month ago with Towcester Studio Band and The Songbirds dedicating their "All You Need Is Love Concert" to the 3rd Anniversary of the full invasion of Ukraine. The ambulance itself was then paid for by the Towcester Rotary branch, and driven the 1350 miles to Lviv by honorary member Steve Challen, and Alex Donaldson - Alex's 6th drive to Lviv! Steve and Alex personally covered all transport and travelling costs.














As part of their journey, the team visited the Ukrainian town of Zhydachiv, which twinned with the town of Towcester in January 2024. There, they were met by the local Mayor, Volodymyr Levko, and on behalf of Towcester Town Mayor, Cllr Damian Reynolds, handed over a signed gift and Rotary flag from the town. In return, Steve and Alex received a Zhydachiv flag for Towcester, and some personal gifts. Steve and Alex also collected twinning documents to bring back to Towcester for signature. During the visit, Steve and Alex were invited to speak on local radio about how they came to support Ukraine over the past three years.



The team then returned to Lviv to meet local members of two local Rotary groups before handing over the vehicle and its huge contents, to Tetiana Rudnik, founder of Ukraine aid organisation, Ukraine-Mother. Tetiana's husband, Artur Rudnik, who was recently conscripted to the army, was released for two days to help with the onward 335 mile drive to Kyiv. Here, Tetiana will distribute the contents to various hospitals, paramedic teams, and individuals in need. The ambulance will then be given to military paramedics treating casualties in the far east of Ukraine.

We receive no funding from the government or central Church of England for upkeep or clergy. While we gratefully benefit from local charity support, much of our funding and maintenance comes from generous donations from church members and volunteers.

Help us preserve the heritage of St Lawrence Church

We are proud to keep the church open daily for locals and visitors of Towcester to enjoy. Many towns have to keep their churches locked, but St Lawrence remains open from 9:30 AM to at least 5 PM. We hold services every Wednesday at 10:15 AM and Sundays at 9:15 AM — a little early, but it leaves the rest of the day free!

St Lawrence is truly a treasure, full of historical significance. Some highlights include the Roman floor tiles, William Sponne's cadaver tomb, and medieval wall paintings. It's more than a venue for baptisms, weddings, and funerals; many people in Towcester consider it their place of rootedness and faith.



When was the last time you visited St Lawrence Church?

The clergy and Church Council (PCC) are eager to make the building more welcoming, not just for congregation members, but also for the many civic events we host throughout the year — from Remembrance Sunday and Christmas to local concerts by Towcester Choral Society, Towcester Studio Band, and the Cwm Bach Choir, as well as school services. It's essential that our welcome extends beyond smiling faces, ensuring the space is warm and fit for purpose.



As I sit in the church, I often reflect on the generations who have worshipped here and the place it holds in the hearts of many. Looking ahead, the Church Council has recently met with the Diocese Advisory Council (DAC) to discuss potential improvements to the building. We have three key projects in mind:

- **Heating**: Our gas boiler is outdated, and despite our efforts, the church remains cold during the winter months. After an extensive feasibility study, we are looking to install radiant heaters at an estimated cost of £70,000.
- **Visual Equipment**: We hope to install a fixed projector and screen to enhance our Family Worship and expand the church's use for concerts, film showings, and other events at an estimated cost of £13,000.
- Flexible Space: We would like to remove some pews at the front to create a more usable space for social events, children's groups, and community gatherings. This will also involve repairing the wooden parquet flooring. The wood flooring repairs are estimated to cost £12,500

Together, we can help bring this vision to life.

Dear friends, quite some time ago, the Holy Father, Pope Francis announced the intention that 2025 should be a Jubilee Year for the Catholic Church; a year of Jubilee, something which happens every 25 years. You will have no doubt noted the logo for the Jubilee Year, containing the words reflecting its theme, "Pilgrims of Hope".

But what does this mean, especially given the many and varied current global challenges facing us today: ongoing conflict in many parts of the world; natural and other disasters causing widespread devastation and destruction of peoples' lives and homes; Domestic and International governance and words causing fear and tension; and Pope Francis himself became very seriously ill, and only now at the time of me writing this article in mid-March, is on a slow and fragile road to recovery. Has the church become disconnected with the world around us?

These thoughts are understandable, but from the very beginning, Pope Francis urged pilgrims (and by association all people of goodwill) to embrace Hope as "a divine strength that enables new beginnings"

Speaking to the many pilgrims gathered inside the Vatican's audience chamber at the beginning of the year. the pope emphasised that hope is not merely a nice character trait but rather a theological virtue that represents "strength to be asked for" from God. He went on to say, "Many of you are here in Rome as 'pilgrims of hope'. Indeed, the Jubilee is a new beginning, the possibility for everyone to start anew from God.

With the Jubilee we start a new life, a new phase." The pope highlighted how the Latin word "virtus" means strength, explaining that hope, therefore, comes as a gift from God to bring us an inner grace-filled strength, rather than existing as a mere habit or personality trait. Well, here we are in the middle of 2025 – how things are globally or even locally, I can only guess. I hope and pray you are doing ok.

Christian hope is one of the three theological virtues — along with faith and charity — which God pours into the hearts of the faithful. Do not let your heart despair! Trust in God still! Such a positive encouragement I carry with me each day — whatever the "weather of life". Will you join me in this hope — you'd be most welcome!

Wildlife on our doorstep

Last August, I wrote about dogs' impact on the environment. At that time, I didn't know the chemical used for flea treatment in dogs was a neonicotinoid, harmful to insects like bees. In rivers, mayfly and dragonfly larvae are especially vulnerable, affecting fish, birds, bats, and others up the food chain.

The Government's response is slow, but you can help. Below is a guide to dog grooming that I recommend to you:

Green Guide to Dog Grooming

Use flea treatments only when necessary and consider chemical-free alternatives:

- Brush regularly to remove eggs and larvae, and use a fine-toothed comb for adult insects.
- Bathe with herbal shampoos containing neem oil, lavender, and rosemary.
- Buy a flea collar with natural ingredients like cedar wood and eucalyptus.

Recent research shows insecticides on pet fur, collected by birds for nests, are harmful. Neonicotinoids were found in all Blue Tit and Great Tit nests studied, with more dead chicks or unhatched eggs where chemical levels were higher.

Since my last article in the Town Crier, I've noted three new species at Malthouse Court: One was a Scarlet Tiger larva, which was unexpected at this time of year. This moth, recorded in Northamptonshire in 1885, is likely establishing due to global warming. Its adult form is stunning, with striking forewings and scarlet hind wings. The other new species were the Daddy-long-

The other new species were the Daddy-longlegs spider and the Small Black Ant, both common. The spider's increase is linked to a decline in House Spiders.

By now, many migratory birds have arrived. The whitethroat, a warbler, is not common but lives in hedgerows and scrub. I heard a male singing in Tove Wetlands Pocket Park on 27th April 2020. By 15th June, I noted four males, though only two were singing. No nests were found, but two singing males suggested nesting. In 2021, I recorded three singing males but have not seen any recently. This might be due to dense scrub or disturbances.

Please stick to footpaths and keep dogs leashed so as not to disturb nests and please don't put dog fur out for nesting if your dog has been treated for fleas.



A Carpet of Bluebells: Discover the Magic of the Badby Woods & Fawsley Loop Walk this May

There's something truly magical about May in Northamptonshire, especially if you find yourself in Badby Woods, where the forest floor becomes a breathtaking sea of bluebells. It's a scene straight out of a fairytale, and the best way to experience it? On foot, of course!

This 4.5-mile circular walk through Badby Woods and the Fawsley Estate is one of the most enchanting routes in the county, and May is undoubtedly the time to go. Whether you're walking solo, enjoying a peaceful dog walk, or catching up with friends, the scent of spring and vibrant colours will lift your spirits.

As you step into Badby Woods, you'll be greeted by endless swathes of violet-blue flowers stretching beneath the ancient oaks and beech trees. It's hard not to stop and stare, or snap a dozen photos! The bluebells here are some of the best in the region and create a peaceful, almost otherworldly atmosphere.

But the beauty doesn't stop there. As you continue along the trail, you'll spot: The Dower House, hidden in the trees – a haunting relic of the past; Gentle hills and sweeping countryside views across open meadows; A visit to the historic Fawsley Church, open during summer for quiet reflection; A glimpse of the grand Fawsley Hall and its glistening lake, pure postcard material! One field along the route may contain cows, so do take care if you're walking with a dog.

The return path winds back into the bluebell woodlands and if you didn't get enough photos the first time, now's your chance. Keep an eye out for quirky landmarks like the "fairies' meeting place", crooked kissing gates, and mossy tree stumps. It's a woodland wander you won't forget.

Good to Know:

The route includes a few hills and uneven paths, comfy walking shoes are a must. After rainfall, the woodland paths can be muddy (and atmospheric!). Bring a flask and a snack – there are plenty of lovely spots to pause. Dogs are welcome, but must be under control near livestock. Keep your camera at the ready – the bluebells are simply stunning.

So, if you're looking for a spring walk that ticks all the boxes – peaceful woodland, open views, historical charm, and one of nature's greatest floral displays – this Badby & Fawsley Double Loop is calling your name. Get out there, breathe it in, and let May work its magic.
