

TOWN COUNCIL NEWS

TOVE WETLAND POCKET PARK

Work is currently underway to address the accumulation of Canadian Pondweed in the balancing lake at Tove Wetland Pocket Park. Volunteers from the Tove Wetland Pocket Park Committee previously maintained this lake until the committee disbanded a few years ago. After consulting with the Northamptonshire Amphibian and Reptile Group and dealing with several unfulfilled quotations, the works could finally proceed. This initiative will restore the lake to its original purpose; enhancing the park's biodiversity, and offering local children opportunities for pond-dipping and bug sweeping. Works include:

- Cutting and clearing vegetation from two inlets and headwalls to facilitate access for a 360 excavator to help remove silt and create clearer channels to the rest of the pond and outlet, improving water flow and preventing future silt accumulation.
- Coppicing and trimming various willows and shrubs/trees around the balancing pond to ensure better access for ongoing work and aid future maintenance.
- Using a 360 long reach excavator to remove silt and vegetation from the pond while preserving small pockets that do not obstruct water flow or the pond's function.
- Excavating a deeper area near the outflow to create a 'silt trap' for easier future maintenance
- Neatly stacking silt and vegetation around the pond's perimeter to allow invertebrates. animals, and water to re-enter the pond. This material will be landscaped around the edges, ensuring no waste is removed from the site.
- Restoring any areas surrounding the pond as needed, including topsoil application, seed leveling, and re-grading.

Scheduled for October and November, these activities minimise disruption to natural habitats and allowed for the coppicing of trees and other vegetation outside the bird nesting season. The Town Council apologises for any disturbances caused to residents during this work.

CA-WN PROJECT AT BRACKLEY ROAD CEMETERY



Towcester Town Council has recently engaged with Climate Action West Northants (CA-WN) to assess practical opportunities for expanding an existing area of the Cemetery that is managed for wildlife. The objective is to encourage a carefully controlled natural recovery that will allow wildlife to flourish. The proposal, in collaboration with the cemetery contractor and local wildlife enthusiasts, is to create a low maintenance grassland meadow feature that, in due course, will incorporate a wheelchair-friendly pathway. In the early stages of the project, temporary signs will explain the wildlife recovery process and, once the area has matured, a permanent interpretation board will be installed to highlight features of the area and identify the species of plants, invertebrates, mammals and birds that it supports. The Town Council and CA-WN are at the starting point of this project and further information will be included in the next edition of the Town Crier.



UKRAINE AID

HUGE CARE HOME WIN + 2 AMBULANCES

The Tove Benefice continue their work supporting Ukraine, donating 2 further ambulances full of medical and humanitarian aid, plus the contents of a 21-bedroom Care Home recently closed in Silverstone.

Always on the lookout for redundant or unwanted items that can support medical and rehabilitation institutions in Ukraine, in September, the Tove team joined forces with Milton Keynes based aid organisation, Help Ukraine BAMK UK, to remove and transport the Care Home contents to Ukraine's national eye hospital, The Filatov Institute, in the war torn south of Ukraine. This amazing achievement was only possible thanks to the generosity and trust of Care Home owner, Mr Popat, and over 30 volunteers who helped remove and load the contents into the huge articulated lorry. After loading additional aid from the MK team, and Towcester, the huge articulated lorry was full to capacity with over 8 tons of aid.

The team have also continued their delivery and donation of ambulances full of aid. In July, Alex Donaldson and Clive Sparling drove the 1350 miles to Lviv, replacing an ambulance for a community that is under partial curfew due to its close proximity to the frontline on the far east of Ukraine. The ambulance was funded by many generous donations, including that from Thomas Becket School in Northampton.









Then in October Alex Donaldson completed his 8th drive to Ukraine, with Steve Challen and Uliana Teslia, and members of Northampton Becket Rotary who delivered a second ambulance. The Towcester ambulance was donated to a military paramedic team in memory of Uliana's friend Maryna who was tragically killed alongside other paramedics in early August. Maryna was an art curator at the Chernihiv Regional Art Museum. In March 2023, during the offensive on Chernihiv, she volunteered and joined the Armed Forces of Ukraine, and became later a combat paramedic. She left a daughter aged 15.

The team would like to offer thanks to everyone who has once again supported the aid efforts this year, especially the incredible Towcester Rotary. Help Ukraine BAMK UK continue to seek donations of humanitarian and medical aid.

TOWCESTER CHEESECAKE MAKES A COMEBACK!

Did you know that while Stilton is known for its cheese, Melton Mowbray for its pies, Bakewell for its tart, and Yorkshire for its pudding, Towcester was once famous for its cheesecake?

The Towcester Cheesecake originated in the 1940s, created by local baker Thomas Adams. This delightful dessert, made with cheese curd, currants, and breadcrumbs nestled in a puff pastry shell, was sold at the Oliver Adams shop on the corner of Park Street until it closed its doors in 2017.



Now, Hobbs Coffee Bar has brought this cherished local treat back to life, adding the Towcester Cheesecake to its menu after receiving numerous requests from devoted customers eager to see this dessert return.



Local baker Kim, from Kim's Cakes, has eagerly accepted the challenge and will supply the Towcester Cheesecake, along with her selection of other mouth-watering cakes, all available at Hobbs on Swinneyford Road.



The renew169 Wellbeing Café, located in the heart of Towcester on Watling Steet, is now in its seventh year and the services and support we provide are needed now more than ever.

We are 'A quiet shared space in Towcester where it's Ok not to be Ok' but what does that mean and what do we do to help and support the local community?

For a start, we have drop-in sessions every Monday to Thursday, 10.00am – 3.00pm, where anyone can just pop in for a chat with a friendly face over a cuppa and cake, no booking necessary – just come as you are!

In addition to our drop-in service, we offer a range of scheduled activities and sessions throughout the week.

Tuesdays are busy, with a session at the Community Garden at The Tove Valley Centre on Northampton Road, from 10.30am – 1.00pm, Lunch club at the Café at midday where visitors are assured of something tasty followed by an afternoon crafting session starting at 1.00pm.

On Wednesdays we have Stroll and Soup at 12.00pm where we get outside in the fresh air and have a wander around the Watermeadows or local parks before heading back to the café for a warming bowl of homemade soup.

There is another session at the Community Garden on Thursday from 10.30am – 1.00pm and a Sandwich Club at midday for lunch at the Cafe.

On Friday we offer a Grief, Comfort and Coffee session, from 10.00am – 11.30am for anyone going through bereavement and loss, who needs to talk and we have a qualified, professional grief councillor to provide comfort and understanding.

In addition to the weekly activities, Renew169 has a few monthly events such as the "Creative Nights" craft evening on the 3rd Wednesday of the month from 7.00–9.00pm, where people are invited to bring their crafts and creativity for a roundtable session with likeminded people and share their skills and knowledge. This could be all forms of needlework and sewing, wood whittling, painting and drawing, etc.

The Repair Café is held on the Last Saturday of each month from 10.00am–12.00pm. Bring along your faulty domestic appliances, electronics, ripped clothes, or broken furniture and homewares and we will take a look and fix them then and there if we can, or if it needs more detailed investigation, our team of volunteers will take them home and look at it in time for the following months session.

Wildlife on our doorstep

Trichomonosis

I make no apologies for revisiting the issue of Trichomonosis, a disease affecting birds caused by a microscopic protozoan parasite. The population of Greenfinches, the species most severely impacted by this disease, has been declining since c.2005, with an alarming 57% drop between 2012 and 2022. In 2021, conservationists elevated greenfinches to the Red List category in the Birds of Conservation Concern report due to this significant decline. Chaffinch populations have also started to fall, losing 39% between 2012 and 2022.

Changes in Bird Feeding Practices

Our methods of feeding birds have evolved over the years; for instance, we no longer use mesh bags for nuts. By collaborating, we can make a meaningful impact.

- If you notice signs of ill health in garden birds, please report your observations to gardenwildlifehealth.org.
- If you see sick birds, refrain from putting out food for two to four weeks. Gradually reintroduce feeding while closely monitoring the birds. You might need to pause feeding again for an additional 2 to 4 weeks if more diseased birds appear, or for 3 to 6 months if issues persist.
- Regularly cleaning bird feeders at least once a week can help slow or prevent the spread of various diseases. I personally use a diluted solution of white vinegar.

The RSPB has ceased selling bird tables and the plastic feeders that attach to windows, as these "trays" have been identified as areas where the disease spreads.

Observations of Local Wildlife

The house developer responsible for the layout of Silverstone Brook Open Space seems to have favoured alder trees in their planting scheme. While a substantial number of the planted trees are alders, they may not be our native variety. Nevertheless, siskins enjoy feeding on the seeds found in the small cones.

Siskins typically breed further north, but in certain years, flocks migrate south in search of food. They do not appear in Towcester every winter, but when the weather turns cold and food sources are depleted up north, they tend to move southward.

Usually, they arrive in January and prefer the trees at the far end of the Open Space, away from the town centre. Once the seeds there are consumed, they will shift to the trees closer to the leisure centre. Keep an eye out; they prefer to feed near the tops of the trees but are not shy and will often remain in view while you observe.

Early Spring Flowers

Spring flowers are expected to bloom in spring, yet increasingly, many are flowering in early winter, likely due to milder winters and the absence of prolonged frost periods. Primroses can be seen blooming at Malthouse Court before Christmas, while snowdrops and winter aconites typically flower in January. Keep an eye out for these early bloomers, along with other plants I may have overlooked, as they can attract insects on warmer winter days.

Following these early spring flowers, the stunning lesser celandine will emerge. This lovely yellow, buttercup-like flower provides an eye-catching display during the dim days of late winter and offers abundant nectar for early insects.

Fascinating Observations of Ant Behaviour

A friend recently shared a video of ants navigating an olive tree and wondered why they kept bumping into each other. What a remarkable observation, one not many might notice! Having read the insightful book "Ants" by Richard Jones (Book 11 in The British Wildlife Collection published by Bloomsbury), I knew the answer. Richard explains that "the most likely species to attack an ant nest would be another species of ant." He further elaborates that "it has long been believed that each species, or even colony, has a distinct odour." Thus, the ants on the olive tree were likely checking the scents of any ants they encountered as a defence mechanism against potential intruders in their territory.

The Midlands Columbarian Society (MCS) Annual Show

The MCS Annual Show is the year's highlight, drawing breeders from across regions to showcase their finest birds. Alongside local Northamptonshire members, we welcomed exhibitors from Buckinghamshire, Oxfordshire, Hampshire, Kent, Cambridgeshire, Leicestershire, Nottinghamshire, Berkshire, and Warwickshire.

This event is a fantastic social gathering, reconnecting with friends and meeting new ones. Early Sunday morning preparations saw 142 pens set up at the Youth & Community Centre, ready for the 10:00 a.m. start on October 5th. By 11:00 a.m., 142 pigeons were displayed for judging.

Awards began at 1:30 p.m. Jonathan Wooff from Nottinghamshire won the 'Best in Show' (MCS Adult Bird Cup) for his Blue Chequer Dragoon. [Top right] Les Petty from Northamptonshire received 'Reserve Best in Show' (MCS Challenge Coronation Salver) and the (MCS Robin Pratt Memorial Trophy) for his Show Pen Racer. [Bottom right]

Visitors enjoyed guided tours, learning about our hobby and various pigeon breeds. After presentations, we packed up, ending another successful show. We made a small profit to aid the 2026 Annual Show.

The fabulous summer we have enjoyed has given ample opportunity for wonderful image making. This has included opportunities for members to group together for some successful Osprey photography at a tried and trusted location in Rutland; on location at Campbell Park, Milton Keynes for modernist sculptures at the western end to the Grand Union canal and the Guosei art trail at the lower, eastern end; examples of nature photography from various nature reserves from East Anglia to Worcestershire; and a technical macro workshop with the excellent Andy Sands.

Two groups of members benefitted from time in the field with incredible naturalist and macro expert Andy Sands, who wowed us with a presentation earlier in the year. The subject of these autumn workshops was fungi, with a particular emphasis on focus stacking for razor sharp representation of subjects front to back. This technique requires a bit of trial and error and understanding the capability of your kit, plus some processing technique for those without in-camera auto-stack functionality, but results can be very pleasing. This 39 image stack of the Bleeding Fairy Helmet Fungi has been stacked using Zerene Stacker.

The sunniest spring and hottest summer ever recorded in the UK provided good weather conditions for butterflies after 2024's record-breaking lows. However, the results from the Big Butterfly Count show that it was definitely not a bumper summer for our beleaguered butterflies. Between July 18 and August 10, over 125,000 citizen scientists got involved in the Big Butterfly Count more than ever before - and recorded 1.7 million butterflies and moths, with the top five species being Large White, Small White, Gatekeeper, Red Admiral and Meadow Brown.

A few TDPS members were enthused by events offered by Butterfly Conservation, particularly the regular butterfly walks offered throughout the summer, with some of the rarer UK species happily captured as shown.



Behind the Walls: Life in Towcester Workhouse

Workhouses played a pivotal role in shaping the social and economic landscape of English country towns during the 19th and early 20th centuries. These institutions were established as part of the Poor Law Amendment Act of 1834, aimed at providing relief to the destitute and unemployed. Workhouses were often the last resort for those who could not support themselves, offering shelter and food in exchange for their labour.



The presence of workhouses provided a safety net for the impoverished but many imposed a strict regime that reflected the societal attitudes towards poverty and work ethic. The conditions within workhouses were deliberately harsh to deter all but the most desperate from seeking assistance, thus reinforcing the stigma associated with poverty. Consequently, workhouses became a symbol of both relief and repression, shaping the community's perception of poverty and social responsibility.

In addition to basic provisions, workhouses also offered education for the children of inmates, ensuring that they received some form of schooling despite their circumstances. This was an important aspect as it aimed to break the cycle of poverty by equipping children with the skills needed for future employment. Furthermore, medical care was provided to the inmates, addressing their health needs and preventing the spread of diseases within the institution. They were run by a Board of Guardians, who were responsible for the administration and management of the workhouse, ensuring that it operated according to the regulations set forth by the Poor Law.

God and Chips and Christmas When I think of Christmas, my mind doesn't just go to tinsel, presents, or turkey with all the a sharing of opinions. It's about giving of trimmings. What I picture most vividly is people ourselves, our time, our attention, our gathered together. Families and friends around tables, sharing food, laughter, and stories. That image of togetherness is at the very heart of

At the birth of Jesus, we find a family in an unlikely setting. Mary, Joseph, and the baby lay in a manger because there was no room at the inn. But before long, shepherds came from the fields and wise men travelled from afar, all drawn to that simple stable. Different people, from different walks of life, gather around one child. That's the very first God and chips night, if you like, ordinary people gathered in the presence of something holy, sharing in the wonder of what God is doing, or perhaps what he is not doing, depending on your opinion.

the Christmas story itself.

For most of the year, our lives don't look like that. We can feel scattered, busy, and often quite isolated. Community can seem like something we talk about but rarely experience. Yet, deep down, we all long for it. We long for a place where we can sit down with others, feel welcome, and know we belong, which in turn frees us to speak our hearts.

That's why our "God and Chips" evenings have struck a chord. They're wonderfully simple: we meet, we eat, we talk, we laugh. But in that simplicity, something profound happens. Over plates of scampi and chips, conversations flow. People open up, share questions they might never dare ask anywhere else, and find that they're not alone in their doubts or their hopes. In time, strangers become friends, and friends start to feel like family.

It's not about having all the answers. It is more compassion. It's about listening as much as speaking, and discovering that in the sharing of our stories, God shows up.

And isn't that what Christmas is all about? God showing up. Not in grandeur or spectacle, but in the ordinariness of a baby born in Bethlehem. God gave himself, not from a distance, but up close, in the mess and muddle of real life. And he still does. Every time we gather in love, every time we make room at the table, every time we risk honesty with each other, he is present. For some of us, that means we have a profound experience, for others, it means thinking of things in a new way, hearing opinions that we may take away to ponder and explore.

So as Christmas approaches, and as we gather with family or friends around our tables, let's remember there are others who long for that same warmth of belonging. Maybe we can extend the table a little wider, leave a chair open, and offer the gift of time and conversation. That's the spirit of God and chips, and it's the heart of Christmas too.




