

At the end of 2025, after 22 years of dedicated service, the Town Clerk, Elizabeth Cox, made the difficult decision to leave the Town Council. Members and staff would like to thank Elizabeth for her commitment and contribution over many years and wish her every success in her future endeavours.

We also said goodbye to Office Administrator, Rhianna, and wish her well in her new job.

More recently, on 12th January we welcomed Cllr Theo Morris. However, due to the resignations of two councillors, we still have two vacant seats on the Town Council.

IN MEMORY OF COUNCILLOR PETER ALLEN



A Champion for Towcester

It was with deep sadness that we learnt last November of the death of Councillor Peter Allen, a much liked and respected local representative who gave his time selflessly to serving our community and represented the town as Town Mayor in 1995/6. Not only was Peter an active town councillor for more than 40 years, he also served as a trustee of Moor Field Alms houses in the town and other charities.

Peter was renowned for his unwavering commitment, compassion, and tireless advocacy for the needs of residents. His positive spirit, friendliness, helpfulness and genuine kindness touched the lives of many.

Those who knew Peter will retain many happy memories of him. In the past, when health and safety rules were 'more flexible', Peter with his head for heights and sense of humour would scale scaffolding inside the town hall to put up Christmas decorations. Allegedly other councillors would wheel the scaffolding around with Peter at the top! He always had a can do, practical approach to helping in his community.

Peter's interests extended far beyond the council, as with his passion for the countryside, for birds, trees and wildlife in general. When a developer wanted to cut costs, which would have led to damage to water courses through Towcester water meadows, it was Peter who led a campaign that won the day.

Peter will be greatly missed by colleagues, friends, and many residents alike, who will remember him for his friendship, sense of fun, warmth, integrity, and the difference he made in his adopted town. Our thoughts are with his family and close friends.





Ever thought of becoming a Town Councillor? Your Town Council Needs You!

As a councillor representing your community you will help keep it a great place to live and work. You will be supported in your role and will be expected to undertake training. You should be comfortable working electronically. You should have a positive outlook and a can-do attitude and be willing to work as part of a team.

The Town Council consists of 16 elected members who serve for a four-year term, with the Town divided into two wards: Mill Ward and Brook Ward, representing residents from Towcester and Wood Burcote. Full Town Council meetings are normally held in the Town Hall on the second Monday of each month and the attendance of members of the public is welcomed.

The Town Council has a broad range of responsibilities, which include the maintenance of the town's green spaces, allotments and play areas, including the St. Lawrence Churchyard, the Recreation Ground, Belle Baulk, The Shires and the Cemetery on Brackley Road. It manages three premises: The Town Hall, Towcester Youth & Community Centre (as Trustees) and The Sawpits Centre (formerly Towcester Library) which serve as venues for a variety of local clubs and organisations. It is also formal consultee on all planning applications relating to Towcester.

As representatives of the first tier of local government and the closest to their communities, local councillors are best placed to engage with their residents and find out what the real local issues are and how to overcome them.

Local councils welcome and are committed to the inclusion and recognition of all regardless of race, culture, ability, ethnicity or gender identity and expression, sexual orientation, marital status, religious affiliation, and socioeconomic status.

To become a Councillor, you must:

- Be a UK or Commonwealth citizen; or be a citizen of the Republic of Ireland;
- Be at least 18 years old
- Be an elector of the local council; or in the past 12 months occupied land or other premises in the area the local council serves (as owner or tenant); or work in the area the local council serves (as your principal or only place of work); or live within three miles of the local council boundary.

Town Councillors are expected to attend Full Council meetings on the second Monday of each month and must sit on a minimum of at least one committee (noting that the Resources/Planning Committee usually meets twice each month), up to all four committees.

We recommend that you browse the Council's website, observe Full Council Meetings and read the Minutes from previous committee meetings, which should give you an understanding of the discussions held.

Dear Residents,

I hope that you all had a very Happy Christmas and New Year! As we look forward to the coming year, I wanted to update you on some of the major issues affecting Towcester that I am working on.

Proposed Budget: Like me, many residents have been outraged by the Reform-led West Northamptonshire Council's draft budget. The proposals include an increase in green waste charges, a council tax rise of 4.99% (the highest possible level) and the introduction of parking charges across Towcester. In a time of rising costs for all, burdening residents with more tax and higher and new charges shows a total lack of understanding for our community. I am particularly worried about the effect parking charges in Towcester will have on many of our brilliant high street businesses as footfall will inevitably fall. I spoke at the Cabinet meeting on the draft budget on 22 December 2025, opposing these ill-considered measures and would encourage everyone to sign the petition on my website that has garnered thousands of signatures to date (www.sarahbool.uk/save-our-free-car-parking) and feed into the consultation (West Northamptonshire Council Draft Budget 2026 to 2027 Consultation - West Northamptonshire Council - Citizen Space). We need to send a clear message to the Council.

Roadworks: I fully understand the frustration that many residents have had with the ongoing roadworks in and around Towcester that continue to cause significant delays to daily life. I am working with the relevant authorities to find ways to ease these as much as possible and am glad to report that, with constant chasing of Persimmon, the Towcester Relief Road is nearing completion and should be open in the early spring. The next step is to see the implementation of the weight restriction for the centre of Towcester to take lorries off the high street and onto the Relief Road. I am working with National Highways and West Northamptonshire Council to ensure that measures are in place for this upon the completion of the Relief Road.

DHL Warehouse: Many of you will be aware that DHL sold the AL1 site (Land North of the Bell Plantation) to Panattoni in summer 2025.

I had a meeting with Panattoni towards the end of last year. I stressed to them that they must build a relationship with Towcester, so we can work together to prevent further detrimental impacts on our community. Panattoni have now put in a Reserved Matters Application. I am going to continue meeting/speaking with them and am hopeful that we can have a positive working relationship going forward.



REMEMBERING UKRAINE

4 YEARS OF LOCAL SUPPORT



It is hard to comprehend that this Spring it is 4 years since the full-scale invasion of Ukraine.

On 1st March 2022, St Lawrence Church opened its doors to the West Northants area, collecting and sorting some 20 tons of humanitarian aid in just 4 days. Since this time the St Lawrence / Tove Benefice team have not stopped with their support efforts, mostly focusing on identifying unwanted or expired medical and rehabilitation items that could be put to good use in Ukraine, but would have otherwise gone to landfill in the UK.

- 50+ tons of aid collect, sorted and delivered to Ukraine, including the entire contents of 2 local Care Homes sent help Ukrainian Hospitals
- Delivered 1.6 tons of aid to a refugee centre in Poland
- Delivered 10+ vehicles to Ukraine – including donation of 7 ex-NHS ambulances full of aid
- Funded 2 mountain therapy trips for Veterans and Bereaved Families
- Assisted with the twinning of Towcester with Zhydachiv, near Lviv

When delivering ambulance no.7 in Lviv last October, the continued efforts and commitment of lead volunteers / drivers Steve Challen and Alex Donaldson were recognised when Ukraine-Mother Aid founder Tetiana Rudnik presented each with Ukrainian Government Charitable Activity medals.

Aside from donating ambulances, the team are hugely dependant on other volunteer groups who provide shared UK aid transport to deliver larger volumes of aid. This comes with dependencies, and just a few weeks before Christmas "Operation Ukraine Christmas Presents" was put at risk, with three promised lorry pickups being cancelled. However, Christmas was saved by local legend and hero Craig Cartwright, who on his day off (and just 12 hrs notice) took a van load of presents and aid to Brighton, and transferred them to a vehicle leaving for Ukraine the next day. By the end of that same week, the presents were distributed to orphans in Kharkiv, 1900miles away in eastern Ukraine, by Brighton team driver, Harry. Additional presents donated by Lucie from Towcester C of E Primary School, and food donations from Towcester Community Larder, were also loaded on an Ambulance being driven out to Kyiv by Milton Keynes aid team, Help Ukraine BAMK. Community team work at its best!

Covering the cost of transportation of aid to Ukraine is becoming ever more difficult, and sadly going forward, aid can only be accepted by appeal when transport is available. Please do get in touch if you are able to assist with UK / EU transportation physically or financially. 01327 350459

Towcester CE Primary School Achieves Gold Healthy Schools Award



A Celebration of Two Years' Dedication to Children's Health and Wellbeing

After two years of dedicated work, Towcester CE Primary School is proud to announce that we have been awarded the prestigious Gold Healthy Schools Award. This achievement reflects our whole-school commitment to promoting healthy eating and building lifelong skills for our children and families.

Recognition from Public Health

Following her Quality Assurance visit, Michelle Bloyce, Healthy Schools Officer for Public Health, praised our approach: "Staff and leaders have worked strategically to link assemblies, curriculum, and external partnerships, creating a truly holistic approach. The school's commitment to families through cooking clubs, parent-child sessions, and community allotment plans shows that this is about building skills and confidence for life. Towcester CE Primary is growing into a genuine community hub and stands out as a flagship school for this kind of work." Deborah Mbofana, Public Health Principal, added 'All I can say is that your school is a role model for this work – the breadth and the embeddedness are great. From the champions to the food showdown, to the parent 'hot drink to go' morning – it is all so fabulous and so needed.'



Pupil Leadership Making a Real Difference

At the heart of our success has been our enthusiastic team of Healthy Eating Champions. These young leaders have taken ownership of promoting healthy choices across our school, distributing fruit at snack time and even harvesting pears from our school pear trees for morning snacks. As one of our Champions proudly shared: "I love being a Healthy Eating Champion and giving out the fruit from the wheelbarrow." This simple statement captures the joy and pride our children feel in helping their peers make healthier choices.

Engaging Families in Healthy Living

We've extended our healthy eating initiative beyond the school gates through our weekly 'Little Chef Club' in collaboration with the Food Bank and termly parent and child healthy snack making sessions. These have proven incredibly popular with families. One parent commented: "It's amazing you offer this experience in school," whilst an enthusiastic child asked: "Can we do this every week please?" These sessions have created valuable opportunities for families to learn together and build confidence in preparing nutritious food.



Building Skills for Life

Every child (from Reception to Year 6) in our school has now learnt to cook a complete healthy main course meal, and this programme will continue every year introducing increasingly complex skills and techniques. We believe that teaching children to cook is teaching them an essential life skill that will benefit them for years to come.



Looking to the Future

We're not stopping here. The school continues to work with the Food Bank and Towcester Food Larder, alongside Buttons pre-school, to start a 'Grow, Cook, Eat' Programme. We have exciting plans for a community allotment on the school site, which will further strengthen our links with the local community and provide even more opportunities for children to understand where their food comes from.



Remarkable Results

The impact of our initiatives has been truly impressive. Fruit consumption among our pupils has risen from 33% to 77%, vegetable consumption has increased from 23% to 54%, and salad consumption has jumped from 14% to 47%. Additionally, 79% of children have used the fruit barrow, with 62% reporting that they're eating more fruit as a result.

This Gold Award represents not just an achievement, but a commitment to the ongoing health and wellbeing of our children and families. We're incredibly proud of what we've accomplished together and look forward to continuing this important work.






Read-a-Thon Success

Wildlife on our doorstep

There's a mouse in the house!

We have a furry visitor in the house. It took a fancy to a bowl of muesli that we left out overnight. It is a common misconception that house mice (*Mus musculus*) are the most frequent visitors in our homes. From my perspective, wood mice (*Apodemus sylvaticus*) are actually more prevalent. They have a uniquely shaped clavicle (collar bone) that allows them to get through small holes and thus gain entry to our houses, usually in winter.

While living in Greens Norton, a wood mouse unexpectedly appeared in the living room, washing its whiskers on the hearth. Typically nocturnal, its presence during the day was unusual. Their large eyes enable them to do this. After a lengthy chase, it was caught in a paper bag that contained drying poppy seeds. When releasing a mouse, it's important to do so as far away as possible, as they can navigate back "home" over some distance.

Wood mice can be a nuisance indoors, but they are attractive creatures. They leave a scent trail of urine to navigate, which unfortunately, out in the wild, can be visible to birds of prey.

Batman Fly

This year, I haven't added many species to my local wildlife list, but I did spot the batman fly (*Mythropa florea*), identifiable by its unique markings on its thorax. Despite its name, identifying this fly can be tricky due to varying markings. Look out for it on open faced flowers like daisies, keck or campions. Its larvae, known as "rat-tailed maggots," live in water-filled rot holes in trees, extending their rear whip-like appendage to the surface for oxygen.

Often found in leaf-filled ponds, you can also create a suitable habitat for larvae in a shaded area using an old bucket or a plastic bottle with a hole cut out the side and positioned near the ground on a tree. Remember to add water and leaves.

Changing migratory patterns


The Glossy Ibis (*Plegadis falcinellus*), once mainly a Mediterranean bird, has been spotted in increasing numbers in the UK, especially during winter. Breeding attempts have been made and at the end of August ten birds were reported from five sites. By early September, a significant influx was noted, with large flocks reported in various locations, including Cornwall, Avon, Oxfordshire, London, Norfolk and parts of Ireland.

In Northamptonshire, three Glossy Ibises were observed in November at Summerleys Nature Reserve (not far from Earls Barton). This reserve is a key wetland site, though it requires parking fees for non-members of the local wildlife trust. For visiting details, check the Trust's website for "Summerleys."

Has it been a while since you visited Towcester Country Market?


You are in for a big surprise; we have a new team and new products.

For the Remembrance Season in 2025, a small team of individuals came together to support the Royal British Legion and develop the town's commemoration of this important period in our nation's calendar.

Not only did the team repair the poppy cascade for the Garden of Remembrance and decorate the Market Square and St Lawrence Church, but they also invited retailers and businesses in the town centre to take part by providing them with recycled poppy wreaths and local stories of the great wars and Towcester service men to create window displays.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank all those businesses who took part, with a special mention to Jane Docking who helped us with this initiative. We hope to grow this project next year and would welcome any stories of local service men and women from any conflict in the world to include in such displays.

We were then asked to take part in the St Lawrence Christmas Tree Festival and so created a Poppy Christmas Tree. All this was achieved by a very small team with big ambitions! We would like to expand the displays in the town next year – perhaps with some post box toppers, a telephone box topper and more bunting in the town centre. But we can't do this without your help. Please contact us if you have any ideas, time or stories to help us. We would really appreciate it.

And of course, we can't finish without thanking the individuals in the community, including members of the Craft Box and Krafty Kats and Yardley Gobion Craft Group, who knitted and crocheted poppies for these displays and to sell for the Poppy Appeal: without them we would not have accomplished any of this.

The recent Poppy Appeal set a new record, thanks to the generosity of Towcester residents and nearby villages.

With our QR code donations finally confirmed in January, I am thrilled to announce that we have exceeded last year's total of £27,200, achieving an impressive **£31,603!**

Our branch covers several villages, including Silverstone and Paulerspury. These villages raised over £3,500 through small businesses and volunteers. However, most funds came from Towcester, with contributions from shoppers at Waitrose, Tesco, and the High Street, plus nearly 100 local outlets.

Additionally, local schools contributed nearly £2,500.

Thanks to all the volunteers, especially my fellow Rotarians, who delivered and collected poppy merchandise and cans to and from many retail outlets.

Organising the Appeal involves ordering, distributing merchandise, coordinating volunteers, and managing collections. It's all worthwhile when we see the impact on the Royal British Legion's beneficiaries.

My name is Elizabeth Rowland, though many people know me as Lizzie. I am the violist of the Roselle String Quartet, and I am delighted to be bringing my ensemble to Towcester for this special concert, which has been kindly supported by The Rotary Club of Towcester and the Towcester Community Grant Fund.

Following the success of our performance two years ago, I am thrilled to be returning to Towcester to present another evening of live classical music - this time with a string quartet comprised of friends and fellow students from the Royal College of Music in London.

Faith: A Way Through Challenging Times

When people experience difficult, or very challenging times they may think - What did I do to deserve this? Responses given to those experiencing difficult or very challenging times can include phrases such as:

1. Everything happens for a reason,
2. You just need more faith,
3. God never gives you more than you can handle,

These phrases, I would say, can lack depth and, in reality, can be really unhelpful. What is, for instance, the implication for someone who is broken by what life has thrown at them? What is more helpful - is the assurance that God is with us, whatever the situation, however bad, and God will accompany us forwards, assuring us that we don't have to do everything in our own strength.

When tragedies occurred in Jesus' time, and we can read about them in the gospel, Jesus knew questions like; What did they do to deserve that? were on people's minds when they came to tell him horrible news. For instance, on one occasion Pilate had slaughtered some Galilean Jews - and making it worse - he did this terrible act while they were offering their sacrifices in Jerusalem. It's Jesus who asks the questions on everyone's minds: Is it because those Galileans were worse sinners than other Galileans that this happened to them? Did they do something to deserve such an awful death?

Jesus gives the very clear answer: **No**. Or when the tower of Siloam fell and eighteen people were killed, crushed because they stood in the wrong place at the time, is that because they were sinners? Jesus says **No**. Does God allow tyrants to kill people or tsunamis to drown people because they've done something to deserve it? **No**.

Human beings can have the persistent thought that somehow what people get in life is what they deserve - that there must be a connection between the sorts of people they are and the bad or good things that come their way in life. Well, says Jesus, that is not how it works. Sometimes we do suffer as a direct result of some wrong we have done, some bad decision, some action we've neglected to take and we suffer the consequences. Abuse your body, and you will likely suffer the consequences. Maltreat a friend, and you may damage your friendship. The negative consequences of our actions can be clear.

But we still find it difficult to understand when good people suffer. Yet, we really shouldn't be so surprised. Jesus was nailed to the cross. Bad things do happen, even to God's son. Christian faith is no magic protection against tragedy. The cross is the symbol of the Christian faith- the cross, where an innocent man died as a criminal. The Christian faith does not give us a way around tragedy. Faith gives us a way through tragedy and challenging times.



GREENS NORTON REVEALED

Northamptonshire offers a surprising variety of landscapes from the rolling hills in the north, to the scenic vistas and amazing woodlands in the south. If you add the Grand Union Canal with its many towpaths and quaint little villages, that are secreted in history, it is no wonder that they call this county the "Hidden Cotswolds".

Hidden Alleys, Meadows and Community Spirit

If you love discovering new places on your doorstep, then this walk is one for the list. This gentle 3-mile circular trail begins outside the lovingly restored Butcher's Arms pub, weaving through historic alleyways, open meadows, and the peaceful hamlet of Bengal, all while embracing the charm and community spirit that Greens Norton is known for.

History under your feet

Our route begins with a stroll past the magnificent St Bartholomew's Church, whose spire proudly watches over the village. Greens Norton itself dates back to at least the Domesday Book and has a fascinating past linked to the Manor of Greens Norton, once held by prominent medieval lords. The hidden paths and little nooks you pass along the way whisper stories from centuries gone by.

Alleyways, animals and open views

After passing the church, we meander through narrow lanes before emerging into classic Northamptonshire countryside, think hedgerows, meadows, and horses grazing lazily in the fields. Sheep are common companions on this walk, and the gentle landscape makes it a lovely route for an evening or sunny weekend morning. Just one thing to note, there are a few stiles, so it's best suited for small or agile dogs.

A pub rescued by the community

The jewel in the crown of this walk has to be The Butcher's Arms. Not just your average pub, this historic building was rescued and reopened by locals in 2017, and it's now a thriving hub of the village. Whether you fancy a post-walk pint, a cosy lunch, or just a chat with locals, it's a brilliant place to end your stroll. Dogs are welcome too, both in the bar and the barn.

Accessing urgent dental care

The NHS has introduced a number of urgent dental appointments so those needing help can get seen quickly in a dental setting. So, what is an urgent dental appointment? And how do you get one?

If you have any of these seven dental conditions they should be considered for an urgent dental appointment:

Severe toothache - persistent and intense pain that cannot be managed with self-help advice and over-the-counter painkillers

Dental abscess - infection causing swelling, pain, and possibly fever

Broken or knocked-out tooth - trauma resulting in a fractured or completely dislodged tooth.

Bleeding in mouth following a dental procedure or an injury that doesn't stop bleeding

Swelling - significant swelling in the mouth or face that could indicate an infection.

Fractured, loose or displaced fillings causing pain

Severe bleeding from gums, or acute conditions affecting other soft areas of the mouth (such as cheeks or tongue) which require urgent treatment.

Some dentists will class other treatments as an urgent dental appointment, and these are at the discretion of the dentist.

If you have any of the conditions listed firstly contact your regular dentist about arranging a visit for urgent dental care. If you don't have a regular dentist, call NHS 111. NHS 111 will ask you a series of questions and if appropriate arrange an urgent dental appointment for you with a local dentist within 24 hours. It may not be your usual dentist.

If you're not sure about how serious your dental condition is, talk to your regular dentist or NHS 111. Delaying urgent dental care can lead to more serious, long-term complications, so it's important that you make the call right away.
