



TOWCESTER TOWN COUNCIL BUSINESS PLAN 2015 – 2020

What is the purpose of the Business Plan?

In 2014, Towcester Town Council resolved to produce a Business Plan for Towcester. The Business Plan will provide the blueprint for how the Council will work in a co-ordinated way in the best interests of all who live and work in Towcester and use our services. It sets out the mission, objectives and key priorities of what we want to achieve, either directly or by trying to increase its influence on the relevant delivery body, such as the District or County Council. It is 'our' action plan for the next five years. The aim of the Business Plan is to give Towcester's residents a clear understanding of what the Town Council is trying to achieve and how it proposes to deliver this. It details what the Town Council intends to focus on over the next five years. The Business Plan will be used each year to plan activities and set the budget for the coming year. Why do we need a Business Plan?

The Business Plan helps to ensure that the Council can take a planned and consistent approach to:-

- the choice and delivery of services
- the prioritisation and allocation of resources
- the achievement of real value for money

It is a 'live' document which the Town Council will update regularly, enabling it to track and monitor its progress against the key priorities. Because the Business Plan will be publicly available, Towcester's residents will also be able to monitor progress.

Community Involvement in the Business Plan

The Town Council is inviting the local community to participate in the development of the Business Plan by completing this questionnaire, which is available to all Towcester residents and businesses. A copy of the questionnaire can also be downloaded from the Council's website or completed online. The principal priorities from the consultation feedback will be fed into the final draft of the Business Plan, prior to final approval by the Town Council.
